READING AT HOME

With the majority of children now learning from home, I appreciate that many children will not have the same access to reading books as they do at school. Here are some ways in which children can still access a wide range of books from home:

EPIC

I have signed all children up to an online eBook resource called Epic, which is completely free to parents over the coming months. Children can access thousands of books, both fiction and nonfiction, all sorted by age and topic. There is also a huge range of videos and audio books available. You should have received an email invitation from me. If you haven't, please check all email accounts and your spam/junk folder. If you still have no luck, please send an email to remotelearning@st-charles.lancs.sch.uk with your preferred email address and I will set you up. Once you accept the invite, you just need to enter the following code in the Student Login section 'ubw3889'.

READING EGGS

All children have a Reading Eggs account with their own username and password. Reading Eggs has a library of over a thousand books, again sorted by age and topic, which children can access freely. Reading Eggs also has a vast range of Reading, Spelling and Grammar lessons and games.
